Tuition Assistance

The Board of Directors of Christ Classical Academy desires that no student be denied enrollment for lack of financial resources. Where a family need is demonstrated, tuition assistance will be provided, on a first-come, first-served basis, if certain guidelines are met and the Academy has budgeted resources remaining.

Please refer to the “Tuition Assistance for Christian Education” pamphlet for income guidelines. If your family may qualify for tuition assistance, you may apply online at www.FFNA1.com. The Academy has a public computer available with Internet access for you to file your application. The local public libraries also provide Internet-enabled computers for public use.

You will need our FFNA School ID which is **2862**.

To protect your privacy and keep our office from receiving and storing confidential family financial data, the Academy requires you to apply online and submit your documentation directly to our third party processor, Family Financial Needs Assessment, at www.FFNA1.com. The processing company serves over 450 Christian schools. They will evaluate your financial position and make a recommendation to our Board whether to fund a percentage of your annual tuition.

If there are less than 4 weeks before the deadline, you must apply on-line at www.ffna1.com. (Mailed applications require 4 weeks to process and the recommendation may not reach us before our decision deadline)

These key dates pertain to applying for financial aid:

Feb 6 th	Deadline for mailing supporting documentation to FFNA.
Feb 10 th	Deadline for completing online application at www.FFNA1.com
Feb 24 th	Final Recommendations to the Academy due from FFNA
Feb 28 th	The Academy notifies families by letter of financial award.
